

„Integral inženjering“ is a potential victim in more public procurement cases in Romania

The City Administration of Cluj-Napoca has issued an extensive statement disclosing the identity of the individual to whom Maja Praštalo, Director of “Integral Inženjering,” allegedly gave authorization to represent the company. Consequently, we no longer have a reason to remain silent, and regarding that statement, we emphasize the following:

1. We responsibly state that Dragan Janošević has never worked for “Integral Inženjering” and has never received any authorization to represent the company. Since Maja Praštalo did not sign an authorization for the individual in question, we expect investigative authorities to swiftly clarify how it was possible for a notary to certify an authorization without the presence and knowledge of the person granting it.

Because of this, the argument used by DIMEX 2000 to constantly dismiss allegations of our company's identity theft—stating: *“The problem is that some members of the firm Integral do not recognize others, those who signed the consortium agreement for the realization of the bypass. We have a notarized act for the consortium, meaning we are covered”*—is entirely invalid.

2. After “Integral Inženjering” rejected participation in the project on October 2, 2024, alleged representatives of Dimex 2000 continued to send emails urging a change of that position, which led “Integral Inženjering” to reject participation again on October 15, 2024. It is unknown to us why the alleged representatives of Dimex 2000 continued to insist even after October 3, 2024.

3. “Integral Inženjering” was particularly alerted by information from the Cluj-Napoca City Administration's statement indicating that our company appears in at least four other public procurement procedures in Romania. Based on our limited insight into Romanian public procurement procedures, it appears this claim is accurate and that these procedures are likely still ongoing.

However, these cases also constitute an abuse of “Integral Inženjering”—the company has not authorized anyone to participate in any of these projects in any way. We believe this requires an urgent investigation by competent authorities in Romania to control potential damages. For our part, we will promptly report the case to the relevant investigative bodies.

“Integral Inženjering,” which is suffering significant damage due to this case, is taking and will continue to take all legal actions to protect its reputation and business interests.
